Webster nets silver for U-15 Team Ontario

Team Ontario came up just short of earning gold medals at the Canadian Lacrosse Association's under-15 boys' championships in Saskatoon earlier this month, as local resident Jackson Webster and his teammates settled for silver.

Webster, 14, scored five times in six games from his defensive midfield posi-

tion.

In the preliminary round, Ontario defeated Saskatchewan 22-0, Manitoba 18-3, and Alberta 10-9 before losing to B.C. 9-8.

They defeated Alberta in the semifinal 10-7 to reach the final before falling to B.C. 10-8 in overtime in a penalty-filled championship game.
