Landlord dispute shuts down Georgetown Bowl

The lanes have gone silent at Georgetown Bowl perhaps permanently.

An eviction letter taped to the door at the bowling alley, located on Mountainview Road near Guelph Street, claims the doors were locked due to nonpayment of rent totaling more than \$215,000.

According to owner Tony Bonora, the bowling centre was about a week away from reopening after renovations when he found out about the eviction.

"We were under renovations giving the place a new look, new bathrooms, new carpet, counters, etc. The bowling centre was hit by

lightning on Aug. 12 and our computerized scoring (system) was destroyed," said Bonora, adding a new system was being installed when news of the eviction 'We were blindsided

when all this went down," he added.

bowling alley will reopen at this point. Bonora said he is contesting the eviction and the back rent claim, but added the future of the business is in the air given these new developments.
