The top five individual finishers and fastest two teams in each event qualified for OFSAA. Georgetown District High School (GDHS) athletes finished one-two in the three-kilometre Para event, with Kealyn Cherwaiko crossing the finish line first, followed by teammate Ashley Fournier.

In the team points standings, CtK's junior girls' team won its category, led by Autumn Klimsiak (9th), Keighlin Devera (10th), Heather Scott (16th), Sophie Walker (20th) and Emma Tutt (37th).

GDHS's senior boys had four runners finish in the top 20 to take the team title, headed up by Jackson Gates (13th), Ryan Leslie (15th), Kyle MacDonald (16th), Michael Hamilton (18th), Spencer McPherson (22nd) and Liam Berger (57th). CtK placed third.
