CFUW hosts tree planting ceremony at Dominion Gardens

On Nov. 1, Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) of Georgetown hosted its "green" Canada 150 project in Dominion Gardens Park.

The project, called Greening Guelph Street, celebrates the past and First Nations heritage, as well as the community vitality and the group's hope in the youth and new Canadians.

The group planted trees along Guelph Street, which will grow and "beautify" the busy corridor. The three trees include a white pine to represent Ontario and the First Nations heritage, a red maple to represent the present time, and a red oak to represent the future. In the spring, each tree will bloom and provide berries for the birds in the summer.

"There is agreement among our members that Guelph Street is a commercial streetscape that would be significantly enhanced through planting," Lis Turner, CFUW member, said at the planting ceremony. "It is our vision that commercial Guelph Street will have a greater tree canopy and this will reflect the true character of our community - a small town whose residents value its parks, trails and beauti-
