# Halton Region seeks input from rural Internet users

Calling all rural Halton residents and businesses

Halton Region is conducting a survey on Internet service in its nonurban areas as part of a rural broadband study.

Responses received will help show which locations are currently underserviced by broadband Internet providers and infrastructure.

The survey can be completed online www.halton.ca in about 20 to 30 minutes, or a print version can be requested by calling 311 or 1866-442-5866.

The survey will be available throughout the month of November, and beyond as required.

The rural broadband study will assess Internet services in the non-urban parts of Burlington, Halton Hills, Milton and

Oakville for availability broadband connections, consistency and reliability of connections and cost of service.

The findings will help inform recommendations to Regional Council about improving telecommunications infrastructure and services in these areas. Staff is expected to report to council on the topic in 2018.

#### Background

Halton Region is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for the John Street Wastewater Pumping Station in the Town of Halton Hills. The John Street Wastewater Pumping Station is nearing the end of its useful life and requires significant capital upgrades in order to maintain the station in a state-of-good

A wide range of servicing alternatives have been considered, including a new station and upgrading the existing station to address wastewater conveyance requirements in the vicinity of the John Street Wastewater Pumping Station. The impact of various alternatives on social, cultural, economic and natural environments have been evaluated and assessed during the Study.

#### **Process**


The Study is being conducted in compliance with the requirements of a Schedule B undertaking under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, as amended 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.
