On Wednesday, Oct. 18, the library launched its new mobile internet device: Wi-Fi To Go. Library visitors will be able to borrow portable internet hot spots that may be used from the comfort of their homes or on the go.

The new ZTE Mobile internet devices have the ability to connect up to 15 devices at one time, with battery life lasting up to eight hours. The sleek, portable device is compact to carry home and makes staying connected easier than ev-

"We're very excited to offer this new service," chief librarian Geoff Cannon said. "We understand that many people don't have access to the internet, or simply can't afford it.

Internet access is essential for many people: this is a great opportunity to give back to our community, and a perfect time to share the announcement during Ontario Public Library Week."

## Vote to help Georgetown, Acton food banks win 600 dozen eggs

The organization representing egg farmers in Ontario is holding its annual food bank contest. giving food banks across the province a chance to win an extra 600-dozen eggs - and you can help Halton Hills' food banks by simply casting a vote.

The Egg Farmers of Ontario Beat Hunger This World contest gives Onta-

rio residents the chance to vote for their local food bank, with the top three receiving up to 600-dozen extra eggs to distribute to neighbours in need.

The contest is being run in conjunction with the Ontario Association of Food Banks.

The food bank receiving the most votes will receive 600-dozen eggs, while those finishing second and third will receive 400- and 250-dozen eggs,

respectively. The contest runs until Oct. 31.

According to the current results, the Georgetown Bread Basket currently sits in fifth place, while the Acton Food Share sits in 12th place out of roughly 125 food banks in the province.
