Acton driver facing excess alcohol charge

The Halton Regional Police Service (HRPS) issued a press release on Monday expressing concern about the number of impaired drivers they've arrested in recent weeks.

In an effort to bring more attention to the risks of impaired driving and to assist in identifying witnesses, the HRPS said it will be reporting incidents to local media and identifying accused parties.

Early Saturday morning (Oct. 14), an officer travelling eastbound on Highway 7 at around 1:30 a.m. observed a westbound black Suzuki Swift swerve to the right of the road, as if to avoid a head-on collision. The suspect vehicle then turned southbound onto Fourth Line and was followed by police, who conducted a traffic stop.

An officer spoke with the lone male occupant of the vehicle, detected an odour of alcohol and administered a breath test.

Charged with having more than 80 millilitres of alcohol in 100 milligrams of blood is Ryan Mainprize, 35, of Acton.

The suspect was released on a promise to appear.
