Project X Improves Patient Care



New portable digital X-Ray machine is now in use at Georgetown Hospital

The Georgetown Hospital Foundation's \$1.5M Project X campaign continues to advance in its quest to acquire leading-edge digital equipment for Georgetown Hospital.

The campaign is raising funds for the purchase of two digital X-ray machines, two portable digital X-ray machines and a mini C-arm (an X-ray device used to capture images during surgical procedures).

One of the two portable digital X-ray machines has already been purchased for the hospital using the funds raised at The President's Cup golf tournament in July and the Walk or Run for Georgetown Hospital last month.

The new portable machine, which is now in use at the Hospital, allows our sickest patients to have their images taken and viewed immediately at the bedside, thus providing a more convenient examination and both a quicker diagnosis and treatment.
