## no disruption to service

On March 26, Halton Hills Council put forward recommendations to maintain the ActiVan service following a recent announcement from Tyler Transport Ltd. that they will be ceasing all vehicle operations effective June 30. According to a release, Town staff are working with Tyler Transport Ltd. to convert operations and ensure service levels remain in place, and that the change will not impact ActiVan clients.

All existing ActiVan operations will transition to an in-house service offered on a contractual

"Meeting the needs of our residents is always a priority. I am very proud of our staff and pleased that we are able to accommodate ActiVan clients with little to no disruption to what they are used to," said Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette.

Councillor Jon Hurst added, "As Chair of the Halton Hills Accessibility Advisory Committee, I am pleased with the actions being undertaken to continue our well established and successful ActiVan services. Our committee

mandate is to assist those in need, and ActiVan is fundamental to that philosophy."

The ActiVan is a specialized transportation service for seniors aged 65 and older and persons with disabilities residing within Halton Hills. Tyler Transport has provided the contracted driver services for the ActiVan program since it began in 1981. Back then, the fleet was only capable of moving three wheelchair passengers at a time. Now, they are able to transport up to seven wheelchairs and 33 ambulatory passengers.

"Although I'm pleased with the collaboration that has occurred at the local level, I'm extremely disappointed with the Province's procurement process," said the Mayor. "Surely there should be consideration given to local employers who have demonstrated high performance and accountability. Tyler Transport has been a long-standing, valued business in our community."
