

The Acton BIA announced its headlining act for this year's 27th annual Leathertown Festival this week. Award winning children's entertainers Splash 'N Boots will be the featured act at this vear's Leathertown Festival—which will be held on August 12 on Mill Street.

Splash 'N Boots who appear on the children's television show "The Big Yellow Boot", have been nominated five times for a Juno in the category "Children's Album of the Year" and have won the Indie Award for "Children's Music of the Year" three times. These accolades as well as the performers appearing in over 8.3 million homes across Canada as a T.V. show, played big factors in choosing them as the featured act.
