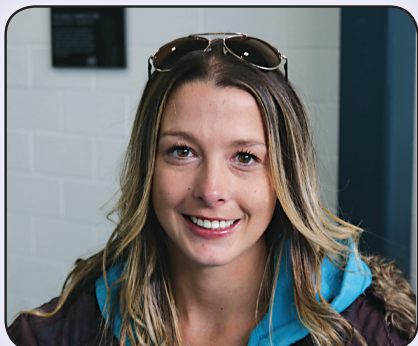
“Do you feel your child’s school has enough security features?”

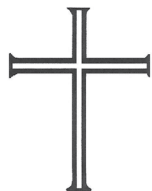
