Other partners include Home Hardware, who gives the garden a discount on supplies, and P.O.W.E.R. (Protecting Our Water and Environmental Resources), the

Progress this year includes new partnerships, an alteration to the Garden's logo, and different gardening technology and apps. Furthermore, the Garden has applied for a grant that will help with multiple new projects, and there's an event they're looking forward to running in the summer.

"We're extremely thankful for all the donations and all the support we get from our schools and other various community partners, and we're looking forward to making this year better than ever," said Golden.

Any surplus food from the Garden gets donated to Food for Life at St. Albans Church by Bill Switzer. "Bill has been a dedicated volunteer since the garden's inception," added Golden.


