FIRE REPORT

Tuesday, June 12

At 2:07 a.m., firefighters responded to an ambulance assist on Regional Road 25 in Acton. Halton Regional Paramedics were on scene upon arrival and advised that fire was not required.

6:15 p.m. firefighters responded to the report of a leaking propane tank at a residential dwelling on Fifth Line. On scene, fire staff found a large 1,000-gallon propane tank in the backyard venting vapour from the top fill connection, light ice on connector but vapour cloud still visible. All ignition sources were shut off and the gas valve to home shut off. A service technician was called to the scene where a connection was tightened and the leak stopped.

Staff then performed a quick medical assessment on the driver of the Dodge Caravan who was complaining of a sore back and elbow. Halton Regional Paramedics arrived shortly after and transported that patient to hospital.
