Transit Strategy progress report

"Made in Halton Hills"

Tim Rosenberger of WSP Consultants presented council with an update on the status of the Halton Hills Transit Strategy, including purpose, rationale and next steps. Part of the presentation included confirming alternative scenarios that will be analyzed in more detail, especially costing.

A "visioning statement" drafted last fall emphasized affordability and accessibility, but in particular given the geographical challenges of Halton Hills, it had to be tailor made to connect urban, rural and hamlet communities by 2021. Reasons stated included projected growth of population and employment, increased ActiVan trips, Metrolinx gearing up for all-day, twoway service, and the need for regional connections.

Transit plans in larger urban areas are based on fixed routes, but Halton Hills was identified at public information sessions as needing to be more "universal access" oriented, which is where ActiVan fits in. Residents' concerns over empty bus routes were identified at public open houses. Three scenarios were drafted. The first featured universal services as "additive" to a lesser degree of fixed route. Connectivity throughout the town would mean accessibility regardless of income, location or ability. Costs can be tricky with more individualized services—i.e. a subsidized taxi service—so cost containments strategies like a zone-fare system mean that once certain boundaries were crossed, a higher fare is

paid. Or, a limited amount of fixed-route service could be added, connecting travelers to GO stations, or extending service outside of town down to Steeles Avenue. Second, universal access would be combined with an expanded fixed route. A third scheme would recognize Trafalgar and Steeles as a mobility hub between Acton, Georgetown, Milton, Oakville and Mississauga, onto which a transit hub could be established featuring a blend of universal access and fixed route.

Next steps include financial review of the three scenarios, with a fully detailed and costed analysis of all three by next year. In the case of the "mobility hub" scenario, lands around Steeles and Trafalgar would need to be protected.

Councillor Lewis expressed a desire to avoid a user-pay system, which Georgetown High School had; he echoed residents' concerns about empty buses. Councillor Lawlor was pleased that the north-south travel created the possibility of the Eighth and Tenth Line residents receiving services, since she felt they might need them more than those along Trafalgar given current development plans.

Councillor Inglis inquired about private ownership, and whether it was an option. Rosenberger said a range of ownership based on what other communities were using would be included in the final report. Councillor Fogal wanted to know if public comment was still open, which he confirmed was to be worked in to the process right up to the end.
