Chinese city plants tree in honour of partnership

The Town of Halton Hills has its very own tree in China.

The city of Wenjiang in Chengdu, China, unveiled the ceremonial tree in September during a trade visit by Mayor Rick Bonnette and some members of the Halton Hills council and staff.
