Man, 18, dead after collision in Georgetown

An 18-year-old Mississauga man is dead following a single-vehicle collision in Georgetown early last Saturday morning.

Halton Regional Police say a 2013 Toyota sports car was travelling eastbound on Maple Avenue near Main Street just after 1 a.m. The driver appeared to have lost control of the vehicle and crashed into several

light poles before slamming into a tree.

The driver and front seat passenger sustained minor injuries. However, the passenger in the back seat, from Mississauga, suffered critical injuries and died en route to the hospital.

The Collision Reconstruction Unit is investigating the cause of the crash. Police say drugs or alcohol were not factors.

He was released on a promise to appear with a January 2018 court date.

Police are not releasing the name of the accused at this time.
