## Making our roads safer

This summer, you'll see more red light cameras at key regional intersections to help improve intersection safety. While the first two cameras were in Oakville and Burlington, we have now expanded the

program to include Halton Hills and Milton.

Drivers passing through the 10 Sideroad (Regional Road 10) and Ninth Line (Regional Road 13) intersection in Halton Hills will see Halton Hills' first red light camera location, which was chosen based on traffic volumes and collision history.

**CARR** Halton now has seven red light cameras at key intersections throughout the Region, while at the same time running a community safety campaign encouraging all drivers to drive responsibly and stop on red.

Running red lights puts everyone at risk. To help reduce the risk of intersection collisions, and to help save lives, last year Halton Region joined many GTA communities in the Provincial Red Light Camera Program. Other municipalities participating in this program have

The current fine for a red light? camera violation is \$325 (\$265 + a  $\lesssim$ \$60 victim surcharge).

If you see a driver demonstrating unsafe driving behaviour, you can submit a Citizen Report Form through the Halton Community Road Watch program. The police then send an information letter to the
