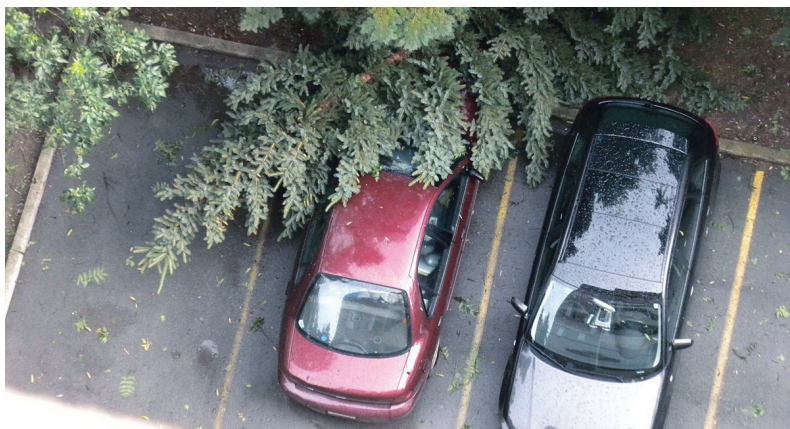


SPOTLIGHT... *on Mother Nature's fury*

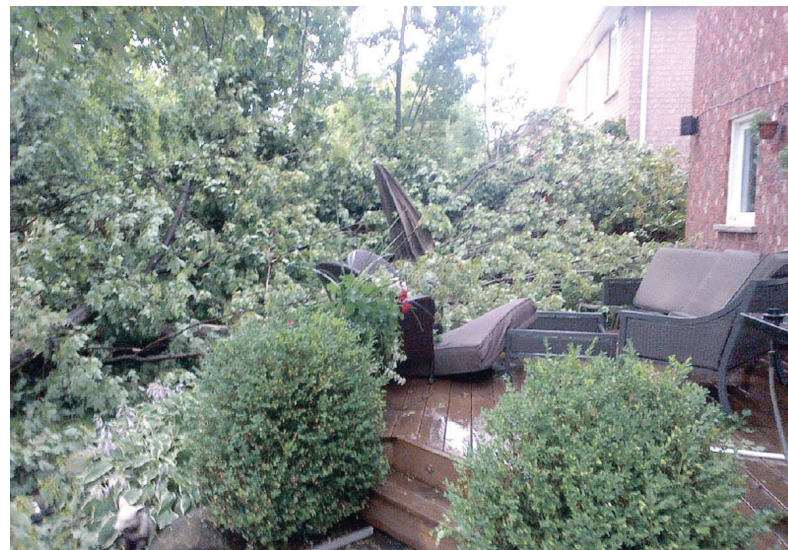
Neighbours team up to clear the mess from a downed tree on Maple Avenue shortly after Friday's storm struck.

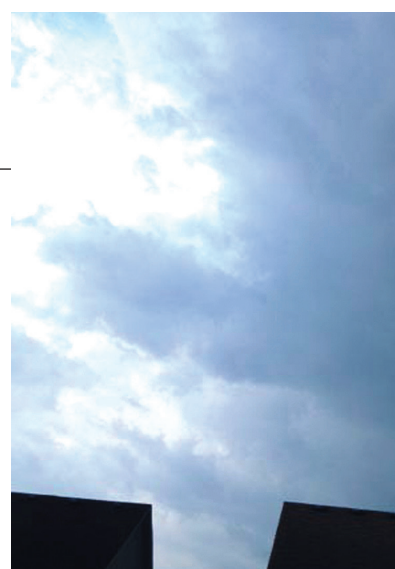
