sions Faux Wood offers the best value in the collection on all the options, in every room.

For maximum savings, Muyal points out, there's the classic value style package. Choice of finish will be limited, the valance and tassels will be in classic look, and you will make an economical entry into the world of woods.

Real Wood offers the widest choice. It is available in three widths of slats and in the widest range of finishes, now all cordless. Both Nuwood and Visions share a large number of finishes with

Real Wood, so the look you choose can be co-ordinated throughout the house.

Muyal explains that many of the new finishes are also available on other types of blinds - custom verticals, for example. With wood blinds available in widths up to 12 feet, I can imagine some spectacular treatments where windows are large and ceilings are high.

No cords

Concern for safety, especially where children and pets play, has created a demand for cordless operation, usually supplied as a special option on selected

styles. In this generation of wood blinds every style is available in an advanced § cordless version. Just grasp the sturdy & bottom rail, shaped to fit the hand, to move the blind up or down; it will stay $\frac{c}{2}$ where you put it. This feature is accompanied by a wand tilt control.

Concern for privacy is a personal and thing, and it's recognized by a Lightmaster option that holds the slats tightly together to eliminate any gaps when is the blind is closed. the blind is closed.

Custom service

The Levolor website lets you study the many colours and finishes in the Custom Woods Collection; when you have decided what you need, take your order to a nearby retailer and ask for the brand.

First, decide on the material -real or faux wood. Second. decide on the width of the slats, the finish that will work in your home, and the style of valance. Third and last, decide on which options will suit you best. Cordless? LightMaster, for complete privacy? Decorative tapes? There are many ways to make the blind uniquely your own.
