BOMB THREAT AT SCHOOL UNFOUNDED: POLICE

Halton Regional Police say a bomb threat reported at a Georgetown public school Jan. 27 was unfounded.

Police responded to Harrison Public School just after noon to investigate the reported threat. The facility was then evacuated and no injuries were reported. All staff and students were re-located to a secondary location, and parents were informed, police said.

An email sent to parents whose children attend the school said a bomb threat had been received by telephone from an anonymous caller.

Around 1:30 p.m., police announced the threat was "deemed to be unfounded."

"The school has now re-opened to staff and students," police tweeted. "Thank you to everyone for their patience while we conducted our investigation."

In a prepared release, Staff Sgt. Gus Bistas said the investigation is ongoing, and there's no known, related further threat to public safety.
