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Artists get apology from mayor

Some local artists upset about the potential loss of exhibition space for their artwork in the Cultural Centre Gallery got an apology from Mayor Rick Bonnette and Councillor Jane Fogal in a meeting Friday.

"We apologized for the inconsistency in our communication," said Bonnette. "There was some miscommunication. They were told they can't use the Gallery and that never came from me, and never came from council. Obviously there was some miscommunication."

Bonnette said, "at the end of the day, me being the mayor at the top, I take responsibility for what took place."

He said it was explained at the meeting to the four artists who have been vocal about the loss of the gallery— Laura Kingsbury, Jan Zimmerman, Inge Kremer and Susan Little— that Fred Helson gave his art collection valued at more than \$800,000 to the Town "with no strings attached." He added, Helson only stipulated the art be displayed somewhere.

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Mold-Masters sold for \$975M

Mold-Masters Ltd. of Georgetown has been sold to U.S.-based Milacron for \$975 million.

Milacron, located in Cincinnati, is to acquire 100 per cent of Mold-Masters' shares. The deal is scheduled to close by April.

Mold-Masters is a global leader in melt delivery and control systems. The company designs and manufactures advanced hot runner systems, temperature controllers and auxiliary equipment for the plastic industry. Milacron is a leader in plastics processing technologies, metalworking fluids and precision machining.

Michael Ellis, Director, Sales Support and Marketing for Mold-Masters said Tuesday, "There are no changes planned for the Mold-Masters brand. The company will continue to operate as a unique entity just like the other Milacron group companies with a continual focus on growth."

"The sale of Mold-Masters to Milacron represents the best new owner possible for our industry, our customers, and our employees. Our company continues to grow in all regions of the world and the Georgetown headquarters is a
