Sandro, Oehrlein shine

David Sandro's performance on the final day of competition vaulted him from third place to first as he took the all-around argo gymnastics title at the Elite Canada meet in Edmonton.

It was the vault where the Sandro member made his biggest improvement. After finishing eighth in the event on the opening day, Sandro came back to earn the top mark (14.700) on day two. His combined score earned him the silver medal on vault and the Georgetown resident picked up a second medal with a bronze on the rings.

Sandro placed in the top six, in a field of 19, in every event. He was fourth on pommel horse, fifth on parallel bars and sixth on both high bar and floor. His two-day overall score of 165.000 topped runner-up Darian Modasi of Mississauga at 164.100.

Sandro was in tied for third place

in the all-around after posting a score of 81.900 on the opening day. The next day, he improved his score in every event except the pommel horse, finishing with 83.100 and moving him into first all-around.

Sandro's Gold Medal Gymnastics teammate Ryan Oehrlein of Georgetown also landed on the podium, finishing third in the tyro division.

Like Sandro, Oehrlein came up with a big performance on the day two, earning the second highest all-around score of the day, 75.350, just .05 behind the gold medalist.

Oehrlein earned three event medals, including the gold on rings, where his score of 28.900 was almost two full points ahead of his nearest rival. He also took the silver medal on floor and added bronze medals on parallel bars and vault.

Twisters take Silver Stick

For a team that struggled to win just two games a couple of seasons ago, the North Halton bantam A Twisters have come a long way.

The squad recently won the International Silver Stick playdowns in Aurora to become the North Halton Girls' Hockey Association team to win that event, defeating the host Panthers 3-0 in the championship game.
