## Helson given key to town for 'generous' art donation

Helson, his wife Rosanna, Mayor Rick Bonnette and Wellington-Halton Hills MP Michael Chong cut the ribbon officially opening the gallery following words of appreciation from the mayor, Councillor Jane Fogal and Chong to Helson for his generous gift. The Helson Collection is valued at approximately \$800,000.

"The Helson Collection is a great addition to the Halton Hills Cultural Centre," said Bonnette. "And we are fortunate to have a local resident with such generosity and foresight. The Helson Gallery will be another venue where local residents may be exposed to the arts."

Bonnette thanked Helson for "sharing his love of fine art" with the community and said it's something "we will treasure for many years to come."

Fogal said "the Town of Halton Hills has been truly blessed by the generosity of Mr. Fred Helson."

Helson was presented with a framed poster advertising the Collection and the key to the Town.

Helson said he was overwhelmed by the number of people who came out for the event and thanked everyone who "had a part to play in all this, particularly members of Council and members of Town

"I thought I would just give them the paintings and they would hang them on a wall somewhere and that would be the end of it," said Helson, to laughter from the crowd. "But I've had so much enjoyment out of what's happened."

"That really started it," he said. "An A.Y. Jackson original, we couldn't believe it.'

They talked to artists and dealers for about a year before they began Photo by Jon Borgstrom buying art, and they learned a lot, he said.

"The end result of that is we ended up with what I think is not a bad collection of paintings.

"We had a lot of fun with them and I couldn't think of anything better to do with them than give them to the municipality so that everybody can enjoy them," said Helson.

He gave the painting to the Town "without any restrictions, they can do with them what they like," he said. "What they've done, putting them in a gallery, I think that is just tremendous," he said.

"I hope everyone that comes here enjoys the paintings as much as I have over the years. It's been a great pleasure and I hope it lasts an eternity."

Chong thanked Helson for the gift and announced an investment of \$350,000 from the Canada Cultural Spaces Fund of the Department of Canadian Heritage for upgrades to the Halton Hills Cultural Centre to support Canadian arts and culture.

The investment has contributed to the renovation of the Helson Gallery.

"The Government of Canada strongly believes in Canadian arts and culture," said Chong. "That's why we are proud to support this collection of iconic Canadian art that includes paintings from the Group of Seven. Local residents will now be able to see these works for years to come," said Chong.


