### Fees at the Halton Waste Management Site

For general waste and use of the Container Station, the user fees are:

- Up to 50 kg – \$5/load
- 51 to 150 kg – \$10/load
- Over 150 kg – 15.2 cents/kg starting from 0 kg

### Did You Know?

The following materials are accepted free of charge at the Halton Waste Management Site:

- Electronics (computers, printers, and televisions, etc.) – up to 5 items per load
- Residential household hazardous waste (paint, batteries, antifreeze, propane tanks, car oil) – up to 20 L per trip, no commercial waste
- Used tires – up to 5 tires per load

Customers are expected to sort their loads by material type. For quick and easy unloading, please pre-sort your loads prior to arriving at Halton Waste Management Site.

If required, customers should bring someone to help unload heavy material. Attendants are not permitted to assist customers with the unloading of materials.

## Blue Box Pick-up Events

To help you manage the new acceptable Blue Box items, Halton Region's standard Blue Box is becoming larger. These larger Blue Boxes will be available free of charge at Blue Box Pick-up Events. GreenCarts will also be available free of charge. You will still be able to use your current Blue Box.

### Blue Box Pick-up Event conditions

- Halton residents only, proof of residency required
- Limit one Blue Box per vehicle, while quantities last

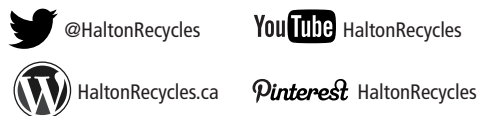
- Stay in your vehicle

### Starting April 1, Recycle More Items

Halton residents continue to be among the best in Ontario when it comes to diverting waste through programs like recycling and composting. But there is still more we can do to divert waste from our landfill.

Starting April 1, residents can add new items to their Blue Boxes including clear plastic clamshells (e.g. berry containers), single-serve yogurt cups, and plastic plant pots and trays.

This expanded Blue Box program will help Halton increase the residential diversion rate to 65% and extend the life of the landfill four more years—a savings of \$15 million for taxpayers.
