Never before has the eternal triangle taken such form. Instead of a young. buxom blonde, this home wrecker is a four-legged, shaggy labradoodle with big, soulful, eyes(Amiliah Goodrich). As this 'other woman' vies for her husband's attention Kate starts to feel threatened, especially since he seems to prefer the dog!

And so the battle begins.

The cast is rounded out by three other quirky characters: the society matron Phyllis (Pam Curtis) whom Sylvia insists upon checking out (you know where); Tom (Cory Sanders) who is full of humorous advice for the new dog owner and Leslie (Daniel Olien) the unisex marriage counsellor who really has no sane advice for anyone.

One brief word of caution. Although delightful and funny, Sylvia may not be suitable for children. Aside from its adult theme, the young Sylvia peppers the play with adult language, especially when confronting cats!
