## Man charged after booze stolen

A Georgetown man is facing charges after police were called to the parking lot at Tim Hortons on Mountainview Rd. S. Monday afternoon.

About 4:50 p.m. police received a call about a man who had been approaching people in the parking lot asking for money for a family emergency.

Police responded and officers found two bottles of vodka on the man that investigation revealed had been taken from the nearby LCBO.

Charged with two counts of theft under \$5,000 and three counts of breach of recognizance is James Richardson, 65.

A 2011 Ford Mustang parked in the underground parking area at a Wylie Circle residence received about \$2,500 worth of damage sometime Saturday or Sunday.

The driver's side mirror was knocked off, and there were several scratches and dents. A toolbox had also been entered and tools were scattered on the ground. Anyone with information is asked to call police at 905-878-5511 ext. 2415.

Approximately \$1,500 worth of tools were stolen from an unlocked garage at a Sixth Line residence during a break-in sometime between April 15 and 22.

Hwy. 7 near 22 Sideroad was closed for some time Sunday afternoon following a two-vehicle collision.

At publication time Port Credit OPP had few details, but a spokes-person said the collision occurred at 12:45 p.m. and one of the vehicles involved was a tractor-trailer carrying gasoline.

Halton Hills Fire Department responded to extricate a person who suffered minor injuries and was taken to Georgetown Hospital.

An OPP spokesperson could not identify which driver was charged, but said a male driver was charged with careless driving.
