

Developer seeks to use Town land to access new townhouse units

The Town's Planning Department has received a housing application for a property surrounded by controversy last fall.

In September 2012, residents in the Mountainview Rd./Stewart MacLaren area were alarmed when hundred-year-old trees were felled on a property at 127 Mountainview Rd. A few days later the 19th century home was demolished.

The property had belonged to Town Councillor Ann Lawlor and her ex-husband, Myles Lawlor, but was sold to a developer in 2011.

Halton Hills council was informed at Monday's council meeting that Georgetown Country Properties Inc. has filed applications to build 38 townhouse units on a common condominium road. The site is designated and zoned as medium density residential, which permits the townhouses.

The developer is proposed to access the property via a Town-owned parcel of land connecting to Stewart MacLaren Rd. This parcel was originally dedicated to the Town at the time the Stewart MacLaren townhomes were built for just this purpose.

The Town's Planning Department will

schedule a public meeting on the proposal. No date has been set yet.

However residents living within 120 metres of 127 Mountainview Rd. have been notified by letter about the planning application.
