


Team of the week

'Dogs happy at home

The Halton Hills Bulldogs usually start the Ontario Jr. B Lacrosse League's regular season on the road, but this year they're getting the benefit of home cooking for the first couple of weeks.

For the past several years, the Bulldogs have opened the regular season with a trip to eastern Ontario for a pair of weekend tilts, but their first three games of the 2013 campaign are at home, including this Saturday (May 11) against the Orillia Kings at 7:30 p.m.

Last weekend, the Bulldogs opened the campaign at the Alcott Arena against division-rival Oakville, building a 4-0 lead eight minutes into the contest before having to hang on for a 9-7 victory over the Buzz.

Several undisciplined penal-

ties allowed the relatively young Oakville squad to keep within striking distance of the 'Dogs, whose lead was cut to 7-6 with just over six minutes remaining in the final frame.

Luke Laidlaw (3), Jayson Crawford (2), newcomer Sean Connors (2), Seth Laidlaw and Connor Brown tallied for Halton Hills and Gavin Lecky earned the win in goal as the hosts were outshot 47-34 in front of about 400 spectators at the Alcott Arena.

Tyler LeBlanc, a 19-year-old from Etobicoke who was acquired last week in a trade with Mississauga, had four assists.

Oakville went 2 for 12 with the man advantage and was led by Greg Campbell, who had four goals and two assists.

Shannon 8th in Mississauga Marathon

Local resident Tim Shannon placed eighth overall out of close to 2,400 runners and was tops in his age category for the half-marathon distance at Sunday's Mississauga Marathon.

Shannon crossed the finish line in a time of one hour, 17 minutes and 15 seconds for first place in the men's 30-39 age group, 11 minutes back of race winner Lionel Sanders

of Hamilton.



Marijana Vrankic placed 10th in the women's 30-39 age group in the half marathon in 1:14:25.

In the marathon distance of 42.2

km, Terra Cotta's Richard Schwass was seventh in the men's 50-59 class in 3:14:56. Hornby's Ivan Wagemaker was also seventh in the men's 20-29 age group in 3:16:34.

At Sunday's Goodlife Toronto Marathon, Georgetown's Hannah Burt finished fourth in the women's under-24 category for the 5K walk in a time of 39:11.
