

Construction season is underway

With summer just around the corner, residents will be seeing more Building a Better Halton signs on Regional roads. The signs let residents and motorists know that construction is about to begin in the area and also act as a reminder of the Region's commitment to maintaining existing infrastructure in good repair and building infrastructure to meet the needs of new development across the region.

Through a number of surveys, Halton residents have repeatedly identified infrastructure and planning for future infrastructure as top priorities. Residents want to know what projects are happening in the community, especially what road projects are underway, and what Halton's plan is for future infrastructure.

Halton Region is improving, widening and reconstructing the Regional road system to meet growth needs, improve traffic congestion and reduce commute times. Below is an overview of the Region's 2013 road projects. Your patience is truly appreciated as we work to make Halton Region an even better place to live, work, raise a family and retire.

2013 Regional Road Projects

Town of Halton Hills

- **Steeles Avenue** 8 – widening to four lanes between Trafalgar Road and Eighth Line and between James Snow Parkway and Fifth Line South
- **Trafalgar Road** 3 – improvements at the 5 Sideroad intersection

Town of Milton

- **Derry Road** 7 – underpass construction from Scott Boulevard to Bronte Street (under CN tracks)
- **Guelph Line** 1 – new traffic signals at the Campbellville Road intersection and resurfacing from Conservation Road to 10 Sideroad
- **James Snow Parkway** 4 – new four-lane construction from Steeles Avenue to Boston Church Road
- **Regional Road 25** 25 – widening to four lanes from Britannia Road to Derry Road and from Highway 401 to Campbellville Road
- **Steeles Avenue** 8 – improvements at the Ontario Street intersection
- **Tremaine Road** 22 – widening to four lanes and realignment from Main Street to Steeles Avenue and widening to six lanes between Louis St. Laurent Avenue and Derry Road

Town of Oakville

- **Dundas Street** 5 – widening to six lanes between Oak Park Boulevard and Highway 403
- **Ninth Line** 13 – widening to four lanes between Upper Middle Road and Dundas Street
- **Regional Road 25** 25 – widening to four lanes between the 407ETR and Lower Base Line
- **Upper Middle Road** 38 – reconstruction of the intersection with Ford Drive and improvements at the Dorval Drive intersection



Building a Better Halton

Halton Region's 10-year Capital Program represents a more than \$3 billion investment benefitting residents and business owners across the region as roads, water and wastewater infrastructure are maintained and expanded to meet current and future growth needs. The Region's 2013 Capital Budget for roads is approximately \$290 million.
