

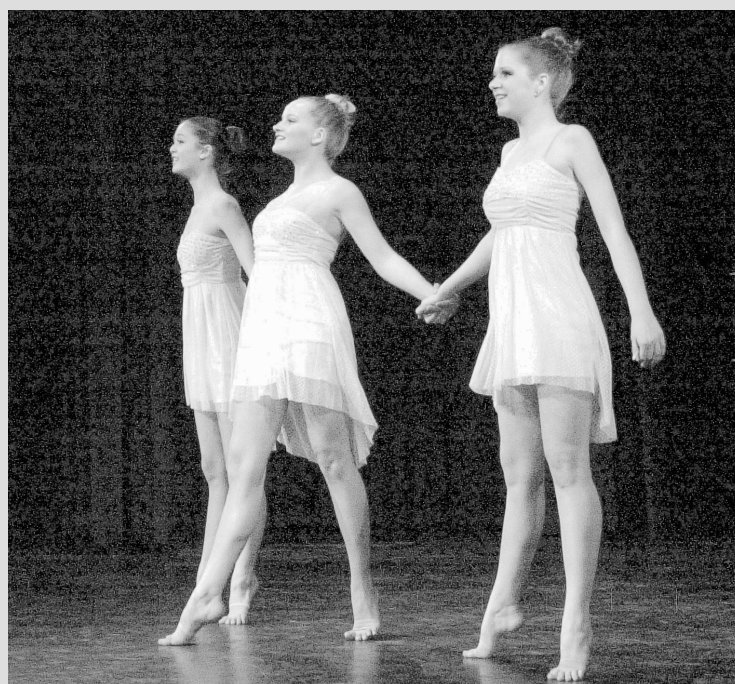
Local man to perform with band at NXNE

Georgetown native Miles Gibbons and his four-piece 20-something R&B/pop band Unbuttoned will be performing at the NXNE Festival in Toronto on Friday, June 14 at The Gladstone Hotel Ballroom at 10 p.m.

Gibbons is the drummer and provides back up vocals for the Toronto-based band, whose debut EP *Electric Kingdom* was released last May. The funky sounds of Unbuttoned are reminiscent of Frank Ocean and have an undertone of hip-hop and electronica.

NXNE is an annual music, film, interactive (a digital interactive media conference) comedy and art festival that will take place throughout Toronto June 10-16.

In its 19th year, NXNE attracts more than 330,000 attendees and more than 950 bands will be performing.

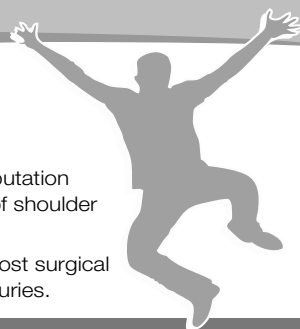
