Surgery in Thunder Bay (1997) successfully treated a spot on my thigh and in earlier in 2009 my brother Jim died because of this disease. This time I was not on the favourable side of the 95% who are cured by the initial simple surgery. While the prognosis was terrible and the various treatments were not fun I met many wonderful, caring professionals all of whom were fully committed to my treatment. They never failed to surround me with love and positive energy. Thanks to them all.

One comfort for me in these last days was knowing that my remains would assist melanoma researchers to further understand and make advances towards a cure. A cure is coming, but for now protect yourself from over exposure to the sun – sunscreen, a hat and cover. Do it


SPARLING, Robert Bruce Paul
