A Orangeville man discovered on the side of a Caledon road this past weekend was a longtime Georgetown resident.

Douglas Brady Bell, 28, was found without vital signs near Kennedy and Old School Road just before midnight on Saturday (Feb. 22).

Peel EMS and Caledon firefighters transported him to a Brampton hospital where he was pronounced dead.

Police have not released how he died and won't while the case is under investigation, said Caledon OPP officer Brenda Evans.
