

# Arrests made in Bell death

Three men and one woman have been arrested and charged in the death of 28-year-old Doug Bell.

The longtime Georgetown resident was found on a Caledon road shortly before midnight on Feb. 22 near Old School Road and Kennedy Road.

He was taken to hospital where he was pronounced dead.

On Feb. 27, the Caledon OPP Major Crime Unit, who was assisted by the detachment Street Crime Unit, uniformed detachment members, the Central Region Emergency Response Team (ERT), members of the Central Region Support Team (RST) and the Peel Regional Police (PRP) executed a search warrant at an Avondale Boulevard residence in the City of Brampton.

Douglas Tavenor, 44, of Brampton, was arrested and has been charged with manslaughter and indignity to a dead body as a result of the on-going investigation which is continuing under the direction of De-

tective Inspector Paul McCrickard of the OPP Criminal Investigation Branch (CIB).

The following Brampton residents were also arrested and charged with indignity to a dead body and accessory after the fact:

- Ralph Terry Maywood, 51,
- Patrick Egal, 26,
- Farnaz Yaghinali, 44.

The arrested persons were held in custody overnight and appeared at the Ontario Court of Justice in Brampton Friday.

## Big Pipe is permanent solution say local officials

The distance of the pipe needed "is not much farther than across this chamber to hook up some of the homes," said Somerville, at the meeting.

"This is not a good news story," said Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette. "This is a huge disappointment."

"We should be looking at a permanent solution for Hornby," said Bonnette.

The outstanding well issues are on Hornby Rd. in Halton Hills and Sixth Line in Milton, said Halton's Director of Wastewater Services, Dave Andrews.

Andrews said extending municipal servicing to the area was considered during the review of remediation options.

"This option was not recommended, partially because the well issues were spread over a very large area much of which is not in the Region's urban (service) area."

"The planned rehabilitation work at these locations will be completed by the

end of 2014. Once the work is done, full restoration of the affected area will be complete."

Andrews said the Region has been supplying water to the affected residents since the issue began.

"I am not anticipating we would have to replace wells, but we could," said Andrews.

"We have an action plan for each individual well."

"I think over the next year we should be addressing them all," said Andrews, who added the Region wants to ensure the modification rehab is effective.

When asked if the Region was considering taking any steps to recover costs to deal with the well problems from the company that recommended the Hornby pumping station be constructed where it is on the south side of Steeles Ave., Andrews said, "the Region has initiated an action in order to recover costs related to the incident which, at this point, is unresolved."

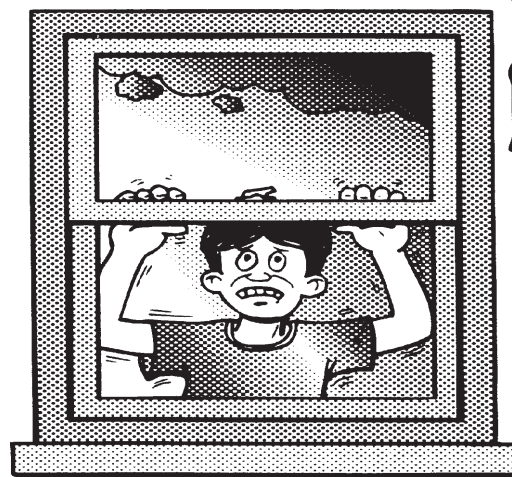
