- the preferred concept for the North-South Transportation Corridor “GTA West” protection area

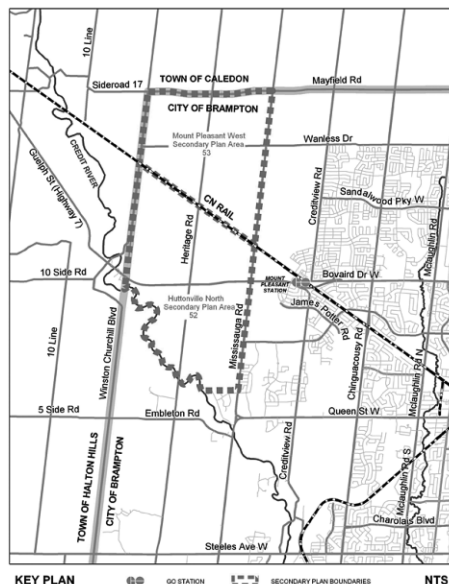
THE STUDY:

The transportation study will assess environmental, social, economic and technical factors, and will address the interests of area residents, stakeholders and local businesses in recommending a preferred solution.

The study is being conducted as a Master Plan in accordance with Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (2000, as amended 2011).

Key objectives of the Transportation Master Plan include:

- identifying opportunities for a transportation corridor crossing the Credit River valley, and refining the North-South Corridor Protection Area in northwest Brampton
- planning for innovative road and transit projects that will help develop Heritage Heights and the Northwest Brampton area into a pedestrian- and cycling-friendly, transit-oriented “complete community”.
