Acton man dies in float plane crash

A 77-year-old Acton man drowned after his amphibious plane crashed on a lake near Parry Sound Saturday morn-

Frederick Laverne "Vern" Near was flying his plane into Taylor Lake to get together with his son Greg and several friends for an annual fishing trip when the accident occurred.

Greg, who was down at the shore waiting for the plane to land so he could help tie it off, watched in horror when it flipped over.

He and some friends jumped into a boat and rushed to the scene to try to rescue his dad. The floats kept the capsized plane from sinking.

"I tried to get him out," said Greg. "I dove down three times but I couldn't get the door of the plane opened."

"I was yelling for him to see if he was conscious," said Greg, adding that he doesn't believe he was, as he didn't respond.

He said it took two to three hours before OPP divers arrived and got his father out of the plane.
