Probe continues into double fatal crash

Halton Regional Police Reconstruction Officers continue to investigate the fatal traffic collision that occurred at Trafalgar Rd and Five Sideroad in the south end of Halton Hills on Monday, July 14.

Next of kin have been located and identified but Halton Regional Police will not be releasing the identity of the victims. Halton Police confirmed that all four passengers of a Honda Civic were from Brampton.

Halton Police Sgt. Chantal Corner said a male and female, believed to be in their 50s, were pronounced dead at the scene.

According to Halton Police, around 6 p.m. Monday evening a dump truck collided with a Honda Civic at the intersection causing catastrophic damage to both vehicles. After the initial collision, the dump truck struck a large light standard then veered off into a nearby cornfield. Its fuel tank ruptured and the front of the truck became engulfed in flames.

The Honda overturned and two of the four occupants were ejected. The driver of the Honda was extricated from the car then airlifted to Sunnybrook Hospital in critical condition. He has since been upgraded

to serious but stable. A third passenger was transported by EMS to Milton District Hospital with minor injuries, as was the dump truck driver.

Due to the large area of spilled diesel fuel, the intersection was closed until Tuesday morning. The Ministry of the Environment was on scene, supervising the excavation and removal of diesel-soaked soil from the farmer's field.

There is no word yet on charges. Police say there were many witnesses, but anyone with information is being asked to call Det. Const. Kevin Rye at 905-825-4747, ext. 5056.
