

Municipal Election Compliance Audit Committee

The Town of Caledon is currently seeking interested applicants for appointment to the Municipal Election Compliance Audit Committee for the 2014-2018 Term of Council.

The purpose of this Committee is to review and respond to compliance audit applications from eligible electors who believe, on reasonable grounds, that a candidate has contravened the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 (MEA) relating to election campaign finances.

The Committee will be composed of three members, with membership drawn from the following groups:

- Accounting and audit accountants or auditors, preferably with experience in preparing or auditing the financial statements of municipal candidates;
- Academic college or university professors with expertise in political science or local government administration;
- · Legal; and
- . Other individuals with knowledge of the campaign financing provisions of the MEA.

The following individuals will be excluded from membership to the Committee:

- Employees or officers of the Town of Caledon or the Region of Peel;
- Members of Town of Caledon Council;
- Any persons who are candidates in the election for which the committee is established or family members or employees of same or any person connected to a candidate through an employment, contractual, business or partnership relationship;
- Any person who is or intends to volunteer or seek employment to assist any candidate in the election for which the committee is established;
- Employees of the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board and/or the Peel District School Board will not be considered for appointment to their respective Compliance Audit Committees.

Applicants must have the flexibility to attend daytime and/or evening meetings, must be at least 18 years of age, a resident of the Town of Caledon, and a Canadian Citizen.

With consent of the applicants, applications received by the Town will also be forwarded to the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board and/or the Peel District School Board for consideration for appointment to their respective compliance Audit Committees.

Committee members will receive \$100.00 per diem for attendance at each meeting.
