

Open berth for Greenwell

After a number of close calls that came up just a shot or two away, Georgetown's Robbie Greenwell has earned a berth in this year's RBC Canadian Open in Montreal after a round of five-under-par 67 on Monday in the Final Qualifier.

The Club at North Halton member was one of four golfers to earn exemptions Monday at the St. Raphael Golf Club course in Montreal, tying for second with three other competitors, two shots ahead of two-time U.S. Open champion Lee Janzen.

Greenwell, a 28-year-old University of Memphis graduate, will be among 19 Canadians in the field for this year's national championship to be held at The Royal Montreal Golf Club beginning Thursday.

This year, he has been playing on the PGA Tour Latino-america after a spot on the circuit at a qualifier held in Florida in January. Greenwell turned pro in 2009.

Bulldogs take on Akwesasne

A Halton Region showdown in the Ontario Jr. B Lacrosse League East Conference final was looking like it was all set to go until the Akwesasne Indians had other ideas in their semifinal matchup with the Oakville Buzz.

The Halton Hills Bulldogs eliminated the Green Gaels of Clarington in Georgetown Friday night their semifinal series 3-1 and all the Buzz had to do was win one out of three games at home after taking the first two in Akwesasne the previous weekend in the best-of-5 set.

But the third-seeded Indians rallied to win all three encounters at the Toronto Rock Athletic Centre over the weekend and will hold home-floor advantage on the fourth-place Bulldogs in the East final, which begins Saturday at Georgetown's Alcott Arena at 7:30 p.m.

Game two of the series will be held Sunday at the Alcott Arena at 2 p.m., with the final three games set for Akwesasne the following weekend.

The teams each finished with 16-4 regular season records and the Bulldogs won the lone meeting between them, an 11-7 decision here on June 8.

Bulldogs' head coach Blaine McCauley isn't thrilled about another lengthy bus trip to the Montreal area on the August long weekend, but said that he was impressed with the Indians after watching game four of their dramatic series comeback win over Oakville last Saturday.

"Akwesasne's fast, they're well coached and they're strong offensively. The travel's always going to be a bit of a factor, but when you get to this point you've got to block out any excuses like that and just make sure we're playing to the best of our ability," said McCauley.

The Bulldogs were swept by the Indians in the second round of last year's playoffs.

In the OJBLL West Conference final, the undefeated Six Nations Rebels will take on the Orangeville Northmen.
