New ActiVan now on the road

A bigger and more streamlined ActiVan Accessible Transit vehicle hit the streets of Halton Hills this summer to better serve more than 2,000 seniors and persons with disabilities in the municipality.

At a cost of approximately \$260,000, the new vehicle can carry 18 ambulatory passengers (or three wheelchairs and a dozen ambulatory passengers) at one time and accommodates about 40 to 50 riders

on an average day of usage.

Paul Sargent, the Town's supervisor of Fleet & Transit, said the new ActiVan was manufactured by International with a cabin chassis on an El Dorado low floor cutaway body, which should result in fewer maintenance concerns and better stability.
