Arrest made in theft of mail and identity fraud

The Halton Regional Police Fraud Unit recently entered into an investigation involving fraudulently obtained credit cards and mail theft.

The investigation focused on fraudulent "true name" credit card applications being completed online and unbeknownst to those victims who had their identity compromised. Once approved, the credit cards were mailed to the victim's address on file where fraudsters laid in wait, intercepting the cards moments after being delivered. Once in possession of the credit cards, the fraudsters would immediately rack up thousands of dollars in unauthorized credit.

A male suspect was identified as being involved in several mail theft occurrences in the Georgetown and Acton areas, specifically targeting rural properties with roadside mailboxes. Regional Fraud investigators, in conjunction with 1 and 2 District Criminal Investigation Bureau members, arrested the male after conducting several acts of mail theft in the Halton Hills area.
