

Town opens new Georgetown park

The Town of Halton Hills has opened a new park in Georgetown South.

Jubilee Park, at 194 Niagara Trail, contains a large playground, variety of swings, skateable features, asphalt pathways, benches and plant-

It is located beside St. Catherine of Alexandria School and through partnership with

the Halton Catholic District School Board, the park shares the green space for a mini soccer field, use of the school's outdoor basketball nets as well as a parking lot.

Construction commenced June and was completed in September at a cost of \$320,000.

'This is a terrific green space, thanks in part to the work of local contractor Grade Control Ltd. and the high quality of work they deliver to our projects," said Mayor Rick Bonnette. "Their skilled construction is part of what brings these parks to life and will be enjoyed by residents for years to come. I'm also pleased with the leadership the Town has shown in the

design and project management of this neighbourhood park."

Playpower (Little Tikes) Inc., Newline Skateparks and Sheridan Nurseries are some of the other main suppliers who contributed to the park development led by Mark Taylor, Landscape Architect for the Town.

Terry Alyman, the Town's Director of Recre-

ation and Parks, said the strength of this park development was the public consultation.

"Town conducted open house at the school and online surveys to engage the public in the park design. We are committed to continue

working with neighbourhood residents to ensure that they are pleased with the outcome and that it meets the needs of the area," said Alyman.

The 0.78-hectare site ties into Jubilee Woodlot, an open space area of existing trees and trail. Future plans for the neighbourhood include trail-surfacing upgrades in Jubilee Woodlot to improve access and linkages to the park.
