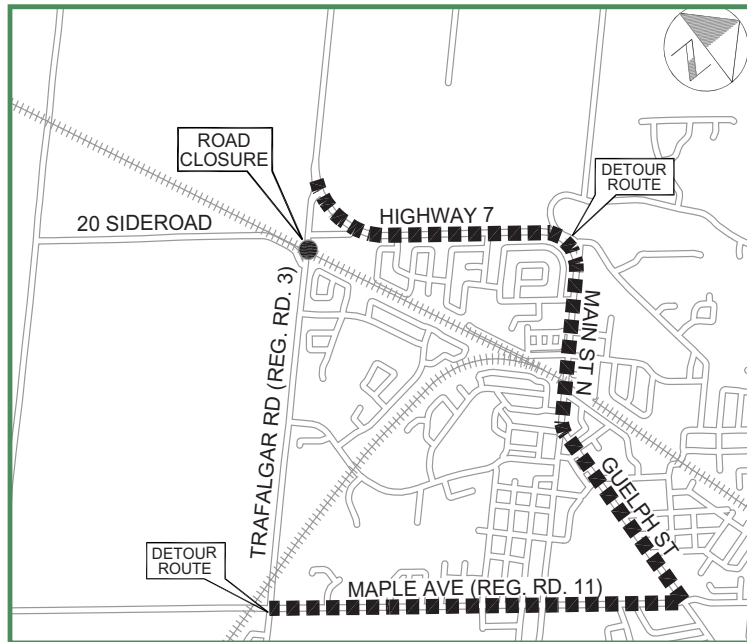

Rug Hooking exhibit to open at the Cultural Centre

The Barn Raising Project, a special exhibition of colourful, fibre art, will open at the Helson Gallery in the Halton Hills Cultural Centre on Wednesday, Nov. 5.

The show features 40 rugs that illustrate the beauty of the rural landscape across Canada and share the stories of how these buildings have had an impact on the artists. The Barn Raising Project is organized by the Huronia Branch of the Hooking Craft Guild in partnership with the Simcoe County Museum.

The Helson Gallery is the only venue in the GTA to be hosting the exhibition, which will be on view until Nov. 30. A free exhibition talk and demonstration of rug

hooking techniques will be held at the Gallery on Tuesday, Nov. 18 at 1 p.m.

A display from the Georgetown Rug Hooking Guild in the Sisnett Lobby from Nov. 11-30 will complement the exhibition.
