Held at the Hilton Falls Conservation Area in Milton, Christ the King's Mackenzie Cameron took top spot in the senior girls' 5K race in a time of 19 minutes, 27 seconds and the Jaguars also placed first in that age group's team standings to earn berths for Saturday's Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association championship meet in Waterloo.

Raiders suffer first road defeat

A brilliant 47-save performance by Orangeville Flyers' netminder Wyatt Pickrell resulted in just the second regulation loss for the Georgetown Raiders, a 2-1 decision in an Ontario Junior Hockey League contest Sunday.

The visiting Raiders outshot the hosts 48-20 in a matchup of the top two West Division teams, who are now tied at 24 points for first place in the division, although Georgetown holds four games in hand.

The loss marked a number of firsts for the 11-2-2 Raiders this season. It was the team's only loss away from home and the first time that the league's leading scorer, Steve Hladin, was held off the scoresheet. Superb rookie netminder Jack Lafontaine also took his first loss against five victories this fall.

The Raiders travel to Trenton Friday night to face the 15-3-0 Golden Hawks, followed by a home date Saturday with the Toronto Jr. Canadiens at 7:30 p.m.


