Halton Healthcare Services awarded NICHE 'Exemplar' status for elder care

Coordinator, Colleen Silver, Nurse Practitioner, successfully developed a strong network of Elder Care Mentors and Champions among our healthcare providers."

Halton Healthcare Services has also implemented a wide range of clinical assessment tools, management protocols, and best practices into its culture of care to successfully address inter-related geriatric issues such as delirium, safe mobility, and falls. The NICHE Program has resulted in better outcomes and greater satisfaction for HHS patients and their families.

"Exemplar status, the highest of four possible program levels, recognizes your facility's ongoing, high-level dedication to geriatric care," said Barbara Bricoli, NICHE Executive Director and Linda Bub, NICHE Director, Education and Program Development, in their congratulatory letter. 

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
