It cost Halton Region about \$1.34 million last year to pay council members and the Regional Chair.



expenses (significantly more than his colleagues) in addition to the \$53,597 in salary and benefits he is paid as a regional councillor. He also received \$1,279 for car mileage and other expenses, for a total of \$69,330.

Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette received a regional salary/benefits of \$53,720, \$1,449 in conference expenses and \$976 for mileage and other expenses- totaling \$56,145.

Regional Councillor Jane Fogal earned \$53,597 in salary from Halton Region, \$2,909 in conference expenses and \$1,462 for mileage and other expenses- totaling \$57,968.


