Halton Hills Council recently presented Halton Hills Achievement Awards to several high achievers in town.

The first went to Helene Carle, 13, of Georgetown, who attained a Provincial Gold (Novice Level) at Skate Canada. She began her championship journey with a first place win right here at Mold-Masters SportsPlex, where she won the Central Ontario Championship. This in turn qualified Helene for her second consecutive National Championship at the Skate Canada Challenge elimination round in Pierrefonds, Quebec. With Helene's 14th place finish in Quebec she advanced to the Skate Canada championships in Kingston where she came home with a well-deserved 14th place finish.

The second recipient is Aidan McVeigh, the 2014 Canada East National Wrestling Novice Champion. Aidan, 11, is a student at Holy Cross Catholic School and is in his second year of wrestling. He has won several gold medals in local and regional wrestling tournaments. For the second year in a row Aidan won gold at the Canada East National Wrestling Novice Championships held in St. Stephen, New Brunswick. He was undefeated once again this year, winning the kids division for Grades 5 & 6. The national level championships are the highest level of achievement for the novice age group with wrestlers representing Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland. Aidan won all three of his matches to capture the gold. His first round was close when he trailed 7-4 with only one minute remaining- but he was successful in

pinning his opponent for the win.


