Election candidates' financial statements revealed

All candidates in the 2014 municipal election filed their election spending reports by the deadline.

The Municipal Elections Act imposes expense limits for each candidate and requirements to record all contributions and expenses including goods Mayor Rick Bonnette, with an allowable expense limit of \$42,940, received \$27,525 in contributions and spent \$27,725. Mayoral candidates' expenses included a \$200 nomination filing fee that is refunded.

Business contributors of more than \$100 were: Superior Glove (\$500), TRA-Scott Fire and Safety Inc. (\$200), United Fire Safety Co. Ltd. (\$200), Maple Lodge Farms (\$750), Agram Meats Inc. (\$750), Strategies Inc. (\$750), Colm Engineering (\$750), 2306550 Ontario Inc. (\$750), Niran Construction Ltd. (\$750), Dekay Construction Ltd. (\$750), Emterra Environmental (\$450), McNally Limited (\$300), Hayward Gordon Ltd. (\$200), David Schaeffer Engineering Ltd. (\$750) and Concept Ford (\$150).
