

Major power outage affected Georgetown residents, businesses

Around 1 p.m. Wednesday, a Halton Hills Hydro main feeder line tripped, with the outage affecting approximately 3,739 customers in Georgetown.

A burning pole cross arm at Main St. and Ewing St. caused the outage, Halton Hills Hydro reported on its Facebook site.

Estimated restoration time for

all affected was around 4-5 p.m., however many customers had power restored earlier than that.

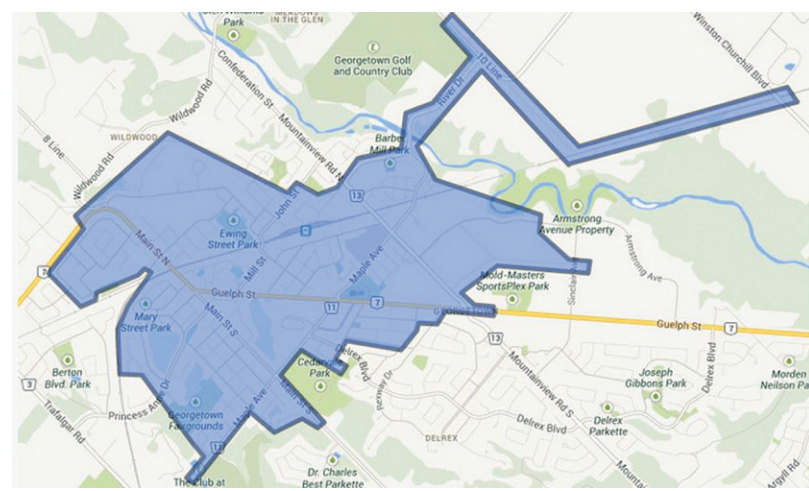
The area affected includes central Georgetown, north central, north west and west Georgetown, as well as large industrial customers in the Georgetown area.

There were power outages also in the Acton area, Fourth Line to

the Town Line and along 32 Sideroad. About 100 customers were affected.

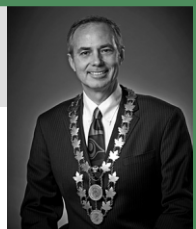
