Directed by Mike Butterworth and produced by Gina Van Raalte, the story revolves around six very delightful and different seniors.

Mrs. Stancliffe's (Patricia Ball) Rose Cottage Bed & Breakfast attracts older, single female guests year after year. Next door lives our weak-backed, senior, sex machine, "Bud The Stud" (Mike Tadic), an unabashed lothario always on the prowl for "chicks." Thankfully her other neighbour, her wouldbe suitor Henry Mitchell (Bob Land) is a thoughtful retired chemist. Unlike Bud's little blue pills, Henry has developed ones called "Venusia" which are intended to aid the libido of menopausal females.
