

Cancer Society honours Paul Murr Golf Tournament

On April 22, the Canadian Cancer Society awarded the Community Achievement Impact Award to the Paul Murr Memorial Golf Tournament held annually in Acton. On hand to collect the award in person on behalf of the committee were founding member Jon Hurst and current event chair Allan Hall. Committee members include Bev Mattocks, Susan Rauwerda, John McNabb, Wade Vickery, Ron Heller, George McPhail, Bill Manes, Tim Ware, Luke Vandermeer, and Fred Reinders.

Only one award is given out each year across Canada. The award recognizes an independent or third-party group that has initiated or championed a fundraising event in an innovative or unique way resulting in a significant financial contribution and, in the process, has developed a sustainable event.

The golf tournament originated in 1985 and was called The Acton Cancer Society Golf Tournament, to raise funds for the Acton Branch of the Canadian Cancer Society. Paul Murr, one of four founding committee members, was di-

It has raised over \$1 million for cancer research.
